# Topic 7 licensing of IP Rights as a vital component of the business strategy of SMEs

#### **Exploitation of IPRs**

- exploit directly by manufacturing and selling products that utilise the IPR
- sell outright the underlying IPR
- alternatively, license the underlying IPR
- (do nothing, and prevent others from doing anything)

#### **Licensing – main points**

- retain title to the IPR
  - so retain control
- outsource the manufacturing / selling
  - so simplify the process
- income stream
  - low overheads, high profit margin

#### **Formalities**

- contractual relationship
  - local formalities, e.g. written / sealed
- registration of the licence
  - ability to sue for damages / costs

#### Things to consider

- parties
  - holding company, e.g. offshore
- nature of licence
  - exclusive, sole, non-exclusive
  - what is licensed expressly / implicitly
- jurisdiction clause / arbitration

#### Things to consider (II)

- quality control
  - pre-approval of marketing material
  - inspection / samples
- termination
  - types of breaches (conditions / warranties)
  - notice, summary
  - run-off periods
- jurisdiction clause / arbitration

#### Things to consider (III)

- payment
  - minimum sums
  - royalties
  - auditing paid for by whom
- sub-licensing survival on termination
- retention of adverts / packaging
- assistance with collateral cases

#### Things to consider (IV)

- enforcement
  - notification of infringement by TPs
  - can licensee sue / claim damages / interim relief?
- no challenge clauses
  - anti-competitive
  - beyond life of IPR
- other rights
  - new rights product development
  - unregistered rights
